

CHAPTER 14.5 DRY CLEANING PLANTS

Sec. 14.5-1 Adoption of Fire Prevention Code

It is hereby adopted by the city for the purpose of prescribing regulations governing dry cleaning plants that certain code known as the Fire Prevention Code recommended by the American Insurance Association, save and accept such portions as are hereinafter deleted, modified or amended of which code not less than three (3) copies have been and now are filed in the office of the clerk of the city and the same are hereby adopted and incorporated as fully as if set out as length herein, and the provisions thereof shall be controlling within the limits of the city. (Ord. of 7-19-82)

Sec. 14.5-2 License to operate plant required

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate, control, maintain, or keep any dry cleaning plant, as fully described in the Fire Prevention Code, within the city , without having procured a license therefor in accordance with the provisions of this chapter. Further, no license shall be granted except on certification of the chief of the fire department. (Ord. of 7-19-82)

Sec. 14.5-3 Licensing fee for dry cleaning agencies.

All dry cleaning plant agencies operating within the limits of the city shall pay to code compliance a licensing fee as provided in section 21-24 of this Code. (Ord. of 7-19-82)

*Editor's note – An ordinance adopted July 19, 1982, did not specifically amend this Code; hence its inclusion as 14.5-1 – 14.5-3 was at the discretion of the editor.
