

**NOTICE OF REGISTRATION FOR THE
PRIMARY ELECTION TO BE HELD ON
TUESDAY, AUGUST 2, 2022
CITY OF BENTON HARBOR**

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF BENTON HARBOR:

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that any qualified elector of the City of Benton Harbor who is not already registered, may register to vote at the office of the City Clerk, the office of the County Clerk; a Secretary of State branch office or other designated state agency. Registration forms can be obtained at mi.gov/vote and mailed to the City Clerk. Voters who are already registered may update their registration at www.expressSOS.com.

The last day to register in any manner other than in-person with the local clerk is **Monday, July 18, 2012**.

After this date, anyone who qualifies as an elector may register to vote in person with proof of residency (MCL 168.497) at the City Clerk's office, located at 200 E. Wall Street, Benton Harbor, MI 49022 at the following times:

- Regular business hours: Monday – Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- Saturday, July 30, 2022 from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.
- Sunday, July 31, 2022 from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- Election Day, Tuesday, August 2, 2022 from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Benton Harbor Public Library will be presenting the following millage proposal on the ballot:

Shall the City of Benton Harbor, Berrien County, Michigan, be authorized to levy a millage annually in the amount not to exceed 1.9191 mills (\$1.9191 on each \$1,000 of taxable value), which is a renewal of the previously authorized millage that expires in 2022, against all taxable property within the City for a period of eleven (11) years, 2023 to 2033 inclusive, for the purpose of operation, maintaining and equipping the Benton Harbor Public Library and for all other library purposes authorized by law? The estimate of the revenue the City will collect in the first year of levy (2023) if the millage is approved is approximately \$229,000. By law, a portion of the revenue from the millage may be subject to capture by the City of Benton Harbor Brownfield Redevelopment Authority.

Absentee ballots are available for all elections; registered voters may contact the local clerk to obtain an application for an absent voter ballot.

Persons with special needs as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act should contact the clerk's office. To comply with the Help America Vote Act (HAVA), voting instructions will be available in audio format and in Braille.
